

Since *Santa Cruz Spirituality* is more than a mere list of associations, I have in the past added to the website some studies which, I trust, lead to understanding of the listed groups. Until now these additions have come entirely from me, but recently an opportunity has come my way to enrich the work with a body of information on *Dualism* and *Gnosticism*, religious worldviews that have greatly influenced Christianity through the centuries. Professor Roy Gordon (University of New Mexico and San Francisco State University), a distinguished environmental scientist entrusted to me a manuscript on Dualism and Gnosticism which he is no longer able to complete. His collection of historical observations needed a narrative framework in order to tell the story of the major competing views of the Christian message: what are they, and how did they come about? In preparation, therefore, is *Varieties and Boundaries of Christianity*, which I hope to complete in 2012.

The adding of a co-authored work prompts me to reorder the website to reflect the evolution it has undergone. From being a single ebook it has become a collection of several works, each of which is an ebook in itself, plus some essays on details of Santa Cruz spirituality and a maverick essay on a fascinating episode of European religious history
